

You're in B-School. You want to do good. What to do? Try ...

Entrepreneurial Studies 644 (ES 644): Microfinance (Fall-b; 2.25 credits)

This course is about doing good with money via microfinance, impact investing, and social finance. It covers the way money is transforming livelihood, health, education and other social problems around the world, including the US.

\*\* It meets MON evening 7 to 9, when we will be joined by world-changing practitioners (we will hear from 1 or 2 each week), and again Thur 2:10 to 3:50 for a lively discussion.\*\*

The course is intended to get you to learn, think, experience, and act!

You'll explore finance for the social good from top to bottom: from those living on dollars a day to the new world of finance where the largest asset managers are finding that they must do social good.

The course is non-technical and allows you to focus on your interests including: the environment (green bonds); community revitalization (urban financing mechanisms); livelihood (asset based finance); health (social impact bonds); technology (fintech). These are just a few among the many ideas this course will explore.
